Board elections are held at the Annual General Meeting in September. The election of the Executive Committee is by secret ballot whenever there is more than a single nominee. All members of the Executive Committee shall be elected to hold office for a two-year period. The members of the Annual General Meeting shall elect seven members of the Executive Committee. To fill casual vacancies not more than 3 additional members might be co-opted by the Executive Committee to hold office until the end of the following annual general meeting. The President will be elected directly by regular members at the Annual General Meeting. The Executive Committee shall elect the President-Elect, Treasurer, Secretary and such other officers as it deems fit.
