The chapter maintains a local mailing list and twitter feed for communication with members. Membership marginally increased to 72 from 68 in the previous year. Local capacity for health economic evaluation and research remains low in Uganda. Two local trainings were organized to improve capacity, two initiatives were pursued in 2016. The chapter entered into a collaboration with a private firm (Carapinha & Company) focused on research and capacity building. Through this arrangement, chapter members were provided free access to a 2-part online webinar on Decision Modelling for Pharmacoeconomic Evaluation on August 2 & 3, 2016. The chapter was co-applicant on an academic grant application to support health economics training and capacity building in Uganda. Feedback on the grant outcome is expected in early 2017.
