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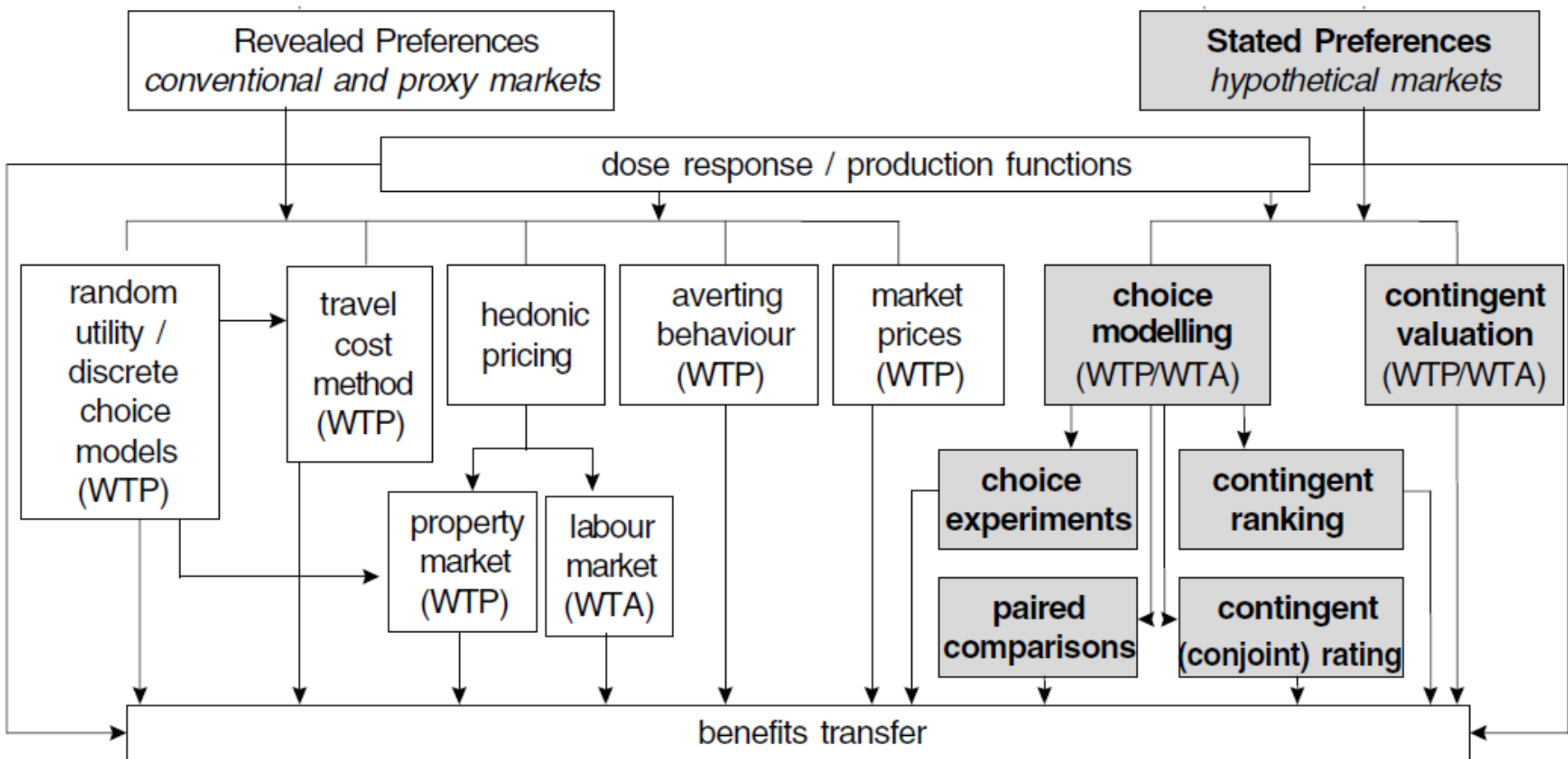

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FROM CEA TO CUA TO CBA

- CBA is Fantastic for allocative efficiency!
- But how to get data
- Can we be confident with data, especially stated preferences
- Maybe easier to convert a CUA to a CBA
- But what value for a QALY?
- Supply-side or Demand-side perspective?
 - A welfare economist will say Demand
 - But HTA agencies recommend Supply since they give a lot of importance to budget constraint and opportunity cost
- Diminishing returns and different values for different peoples
