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INTRODUCTION

One Child Every Child (OCEC) is a Canada First Research Excellence Fund initiative

Vision: Transforming the lives of children and families so that all children will be the healthiest, most empowered and thriving in the world.

OCEC focuses on **three themes** situated at intersections of greatest need and opportunity for discovery and impact:

- Better Beginnings addresses maternal, prenatal and neonatal health.
- Precision Health and Wellness develops innovative diagnostic, therapeutic and targeted social interventions.
- Vulnerable to Thriving addresses neurodiversity and mental health, including social determinants of health.

Six Cross-cutting accelerators provide disciplinary expertise to the research Grand Challenges.

OBJECTIVE

- Demonstrate the impact of this complex, transdisciplinary, cross-sectoral partner-driven initiative, which requires an integrative approach to Value, Impact and Knowledge Mobilization (KM) from the outset
- Develop an integrated and embedded Value, Impact, and KM Framework for Child Health and Wellness that contributes to the co-creation of research that helps achieve our vision.

UNIQUE METHODOLOGY

We are co-developing an integrated family, patient, and community partner-driven model to accelerate real-world impact for our communities. Our novel approach involves integrating value, impact and KM expertise through:

Impact by design designing for impact upfront with evidence of effectiveness in mind.

- Co-design and co-creation through family and community partnership.
- Indigenous and non-Indigenous Parallel Paths, conducting research led by Indigenous scholars serves Indigenous children and is informed by Indigenous ways of knowing, doing and connecting.
- Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, increasing participation of members representing our diverse communities in research to improve its usefulness and care for all children and families

Our framework involves a **customized**, **fit-for-purpose** approach that includes **four outcome pillars**:

- 1. Performance Measurement Plan: As the operational pillar, measuring outlined domains with detailed outcomes and indicators aligned with OCEC research
- 2. Research Impact: We adapt the foundational structure of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (CAHS) framework to a child health specific context.
- **3. Global Child Health:** We align with UNICEF Report Card Indicators identifying specific indicators that align to the OCEC research themes.
- **4. Innovation:** Build opportunities to integrate entrepreneurship and social innovation to improve solutions.

Implementing this framework will enable:

- Incorporating socio-economic value from the start
- Knowledge Mobilization (KM) for Impact throughout the research process
- Creation of sustainable change
