#### INTRODUCTION

High population growth, limited resources, the increasing burden of communicable and non-communicable diseases, and the rising costs of innovative health technologies pose significant challenges to the Egyptian healthcare system. As Egypt aims for Universal Health Coverage (UHC) by 2030, equitable access to treatments becomes vital. However, introducing expensive health technologies complicates efforts to maintain financial sustainability and achieve UHC goals.

Implementing Value-Based Assessment (VBA) offers a solution by evaluating health technologies based on clinical effectiveness, cost-effectiveness, and societal impact. The study aims to evaluate the challenges facing the healthcare system and propose strategies for strengthening Egypt's VBA systems.

#### **METHODS**

Strategies for strengthening VBA systems were proposed during the 2nd annual conference of the Egyptian Association of Health Economics in October 2023. Input was collected from diverse stakeholders across various governmental sectors to identify the key barriers and facilitators to effective VBA implementation. These strategies were further refined through discussions with international experts during a workshop in Copenhagen, Denmark, with a focus on enhancing patient access as a central objective in transforming the healthcare system.

#### **RESULTS**

#### Challenges




Figure 1 Challenges affecting the Egyptian healthcare system

Discussions during the workshops pinpointed multiple obstacles that affect the healthcare system's performance and complicate the development of a robust VBA framework in Egypt. Challenges include the following (Figure 1):

# **Recommended Strategies**



#### **L** Harmonization of VBA Processes

- Establish a national coordination unit for joint VBA
- Establish specialized HTA agencies (in disease areas)
- Harmonization of the funding structure (amount of funding, source of funding, and methods of allocation)



#### **Capacity Building**

- Expanding postgraduate training opportunities
- Harmonization of postgraduate programs across universities
- Foster hands-on training through practical case studies
- Accreditation of short courses



## **Leadership Commitment**

- Document the track records of VBA achievements
- Establishing a strong connection with regulatory bodies
- Integrating VBA into existing payer or regulatory organizations
- Highlighting VBA's success
