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

  - Portuguese













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- HEOR has grown significantly in Asia, LatAm, and EMEA
- New submissions increased 68% between 2018-2023 (36% in VIH)
- The term "emerging" is no longer suitable for several jurisdictions in these regions
  - High productivity in Brazil, Iran, USA, Colombia, and India (75% of the submissions)




### **Editorial Changes Implemented in VIHRI**

 In 2022, VIHRI increased its frequency from 3 issues a year to 6 issues a year.



 All issues published since 2022 include geographical integration (ie, include papers from all regions)


 Increasing submissions from researchers based in United States, United Kingdom, Canada, and various Western European countries

#### Valuable manuscripts

 Value in Health rejecting valuable papers focused on European countries and North America often due to lack of <u>novelty</u>

### **Editorial Scope**

"Value in Health Regional Issues is a peer-reviewed, MEDLINE-indexed journal that publishes <u>applied research</u> using HEOR methods to examine health systems, policies, and patient populations in specific geographic regions."

"Manuscripts submitted to *Value in Health Regional Issues* must **focus on regional populations and regional health policies**, and where possible, demonstrate the broader implications to other regions."

#### **Areas of Interest**

#### **Applied Research Using HEOR Methods**

Economic evaluations or impact analyses of healthcare interventions (pharmaceuticals, medical devices, or procedures) that examine the effect of regional health policies on healthcare performance, population health, or social welfare.

#### **Health Policy Analyses**

Articles that translate knowledge across countries (eg, evaluations between high- and low- and middle-income countries, cross country comparisons, etc) and discuss various aspects of health policy, including pricing and reimbursement issues, the adoption of new health technologies, or policies to encourage "value-based" decision making.

#### **Health Equity Research**

Research that reflects regional experiences using HEOR methods such as distributional or extended costeffectiveness analysis, checklists for qualitative judgments, simple indicators, or deliberative exercises to incorporate health equity concerns into local resource allocation in decisions.

#### **Patient-Centered Research**

Articles that present research on the development and use of measures for patient-reported outcomes and quality-of-life instruments that express the value of healthcare. Research on patient participation in value-based decision-making processes or health technology assessment are also welcome. These papers should show results or impact on the community perception or changes in procedures or outcomes resulting from patient participation in research and policy making.

#### **Scoping and Literature Reviews**

Reviews that synthesize and summarize the current knowledge on a specific topic or question to identify the main concepts, theories, and evidence gaps within a specific geographic region. These papers review empirical studies consistent with the methods outlined by the Cochrane Collaboration and PRISMA.





### **Transition to Open Access**

- Effective January 1, 2025, VIHRI will become a **Gold Open Access** journal.
  - Articles are distributed online, free to all readers without any access barriers
- No author fees for papers submitted in 2025
- Open Science 

   efforts focused on making scientific research more transparent and accessible
- Article processing charges will be assessed for accepted papers submitted after December 31, 2025

"the first initiative to use the term "open access"...to articulate a public definition...to propose complementary strategies for realizing OA...to generalize the call for OA to all disciplines and countries...the first to be accompanied by significant funding. "BOAI10 – Budapest Open Access Initiative

2003: Bethesda Statement on Open Access Publishing Maryland-based meeting that codified need for sharing of scientific research, especially medical research, quickly according to open access principles




## **Open Access Progress**


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# Roadmap to Gold Open Access Growth

- As of January 1, 2025, VIHRI is completely OA
- For accepted papers submitted between
   December 31, 2024 and December 31,2025,
   article processing charges (APCs) will be waived
- Beginning in 2026, APCs will apply with a 20% discount for ISPOR members
- Beginning in 2026, waivers will be offered on an annual basis (eg, 40 waivers in 2026)





### **Advancing Open Access**

- Research4Life: APCs discounted based on a variety of World Bank/WHO criteria that results in Group A and Group B country-level discounts
- Elsevier Geo-Pricing Pilot: Industry's first pilot to support authors in low- and middle-income countries with equitable pricing options, based on Gross National Income per capita
- Special Arrangements: In some instances, APCs may be waived due to author need
- VIHRI Waivers: Arranged with the help of ISPOR, annual waivers to allow for equitable access to VIHRI








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# Top 10 Country Authorship (2021 – 2023)
