



Despite a number of countries in Latin America are implementing healthcare reforms to improve patient access, it's still an unmet need.



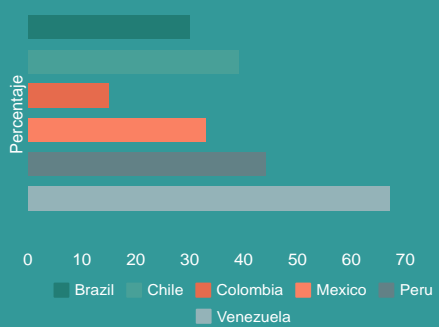
Only a few have successfully strengthened their institutionalization

## Some Solutions

Stakeholder involvement and partnership to gather experiences and efforts to reduce inequities and to improve access to innovative care.

Stakeholder participation in policy and organizational decisions

- Involving might improve the overall decision making, use resources and organize care
- Patient information policies that regulate what information is provided to patients' rights
- Patient information regulations that improve the extent to which patients are well informed might lead to better informed decisions.
