Systematic Literature Reviews and Scoping Reviews

Value in Health REGIONAL ISSUES

Literature reviews are an essential component for obtaining data inputs or assessing the impact of health technologies on clinical, economic, or healthrelated quality of life. Literature reviews may inform coverage decisions for drugs, devices, or public health interventions, and frequently are used in comprehensive health technology assessments. When conducted properly, systematic literature reviews pool all relevant data to allow a more efficient process for assessing value. Non-systematic reviews (including scoping reviews, therapeutic area reviews, rapid reviews, and gap analyses) can also support evidence-based decision making and inform health policy decisions.

Recognizing the inherent usefulness of these types of studies, the Editors of *Value in Health Regional Issues* are issuing an open Call for Papers for systematic literature reviews and scoping reviews on a wide array of topics that seek to inform healthcare decision making. Submissions do not need to focus solely on reviews of randomized controlled trials; they can include reviews of observational studies, economic evaluations, outcomes research studies, and preference-based assessments. Reviews can address any aspect of value in health (eg, quality of life, resource use, and cost-effectiveness), evidence relating to patient-reported outcomes, or the impact of health policies in low- and middle-income countries.

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Reviews about value frameworks to assess health technologies across jurisdictions
- Reviews about the impact of health systems interventions on their performance
- Reviews about patient-reported outcomes in specific diseases
- Reviews about cost-of-illness studies across jurisdictions

As a benefit to both authors and readers, all accepted review articles will be made freely available online without any author or reader fees and will carry ISPOR's standard copyright license (not a CC-BY license unless authors expressly pay for gold open access). Submissions received before March 1, 2024 will have the best chance of being published in *Value in Health Regional Issues* in 2024. Final decisions regarding ultimate acceptance rest solely with the Editors.
