#### **Background:**

The Hungarian Health Economics Association (Magyar Egészség-gazdaságtani Társaság – META) was established in 2003. The founders aimed at establishing an independent organization to discuss major health economic and health policy issues at monthly meetings. Since 2003 META have been organizing 8-10 meetings annually. Each 2-hour monthly meeting is dedicated to a particular research, policy or methodological topic, with an advocate (or researcher), an opponent and a moderator. Pricing and reimbursement policy of new health technologies and methodological standards of HTA research have been discussed at several meetings over years. The Hungarian Health Economics Association was accepted as ISPOR Hungary Chapter in December 2006. The Chapter has 113 members.
