Scientific /	1) 5 themes of HTA reports:
Educational Activities	 Early prenatal diagnosis of genetic disorders FISH-method with the rationale for the choice of biomaterial invasive sampling (cordocentesis, amniocentesis) / non-invasive (intravenous) in the manner of pregnancy (in women) to prevent the birth of an affected child. Evaluation of the effectiveness of screening and rehabilitation of children
	with sensorineural hearing loss in bi-or unilateral cochlear implantation. - The effectiveness and safety of early initiation of dialysis, compared with late onset in patients with end-stage renal failure
	- The effectiveness of combined therapy with interferon (pegylated or non-pegylated) and ribavirin for the treatment of chronic HCV in adult patients - The use of coronary stents (drug-coated and without drugs), established vascular access in patients with coronary artery disease (CAD) to improve the quality of life.
