Scientific / Educational Activities	 Organized educational forums, such as: "Improving access to and use of medicines: Recommendations from the 2011 Third International Conference on Improving Use of Medicines," presented by Dr. Dennis Ross-Degnan and Dr. Anita Wagner from Harvard Medical School and Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Institute last September 2012. These health experts discussed issues and health policies related to improving accessibility, affordability and appropriate use of medicines among vulnerable populations, particularly in low and middle income countries such as the Philippines "Data, data, data: the insatiable need for data in population-based chronic disease research," led by Dr. Dexter Canoy from the Cancer Epidemiology Unit, University of Oxford in the UK on January 10, 2013. He explored the importance of various sources of data and databases in the conduct of population-based research on chronic non-communicable diseases, future challenges in this field of research, and the challenge to pursue such research based on Philippine data
